Criteria for DUI / DWI	BAC \geq 0.02 if under 21 years old BAC \geq 0.04 while operating a commercial motor vehicle or school bus BAC \geq 0.08 for all non-commercial drivers aged 21 years or older
Penalties for 1 st offense	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✧ 2-5 days in jail ✧ Petty misdemeanor ✧ 72 hours of community service ✧ \$150 - \$1,000 in fines ✧ Mandatory substance abuse education ✧ 1 year administrative license suspension
"Look back" period	5 years
Penalties for repeat offender	<p>Second DUI conviction (within 5 years)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✧ 30 days in jail ✧ Petty misdemeanor ✧ 240 hours of community service ✧ \$500-1,500 in fines ✧ 18 months administrative license suspension <p>Third DUI conviction (within 5 years)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✧ 10-30 days in jail ✧ Petty misdemeanor ✧ \$500-2,500 in fines ✧ 2 years administrative license suspension <p>Fourth or subsequent offense</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✧ Class C felony <p>Breath Test Refusal Penalties</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✧ First refusal: One year administrative license suspension ✧ Any additional refusals: Two-five years of suspension
License suspensions	<p>1st offense: 1 year</p> <p>2nd offense: 18 months</p> <p>3rd offense: 2 years</p>
Ignition interlocks	<p>For first offense: 1 year revocation of license and privilege to operate a vehicle during the revocation period and installation during the revocation period of an ignition interlock device on any vehicle operated by the person.</p> <p>For second offense within 5 years or first conviction if Highly Intoxicated: A 2 year revocation of license and privilege to operate a vehicle during the revocation period</p>

Vehicle impoundment	No
Open Container laws	Open container must be in trunk or otherwise inaccessible to driver and passengers, a utility or glove compartment is deemed to be accessible to driver and passengers.
