Idaho DUI / DWI Regulations

	Any person who has been found guilty of DUI within the prior 10 years, installation of an ignition interlock is mandatory.
Vehicle impoundment	No
Open Container laws	Open container must be in locked glove box, trunk, or otherwise inaccessible to driver and passengers, but does not apply to passengers of hired vehicles, motor homes, or house trailers.
	Driver of passengers unlawfully in violation is guilty of a misdemeanor, while passengers are merely guilty of an infraction.
